God's Way To Be Encouraged And Growing

Introduction

- ♦ Acts 19 is one piece of a great spiritual pie.
- ♦ It reveals God's working in a spiritual way.
- ♦ It leads us to spiritual progress in our hearts.

Question: What's the context of Acts 19?

Answer: The context is this:

- 1. Acts 1 records Pentecostal Preparation.
- 2. Acts 2 records Pentecostal experience and results.
- 3. Acts 3-4 records Pentecostal power and persecution.
- 4. Acts 5 records Pentecostal cleansing in the church.
- 5. Acts 6, the first Pentecostal deacons.
- 6. Acts 7 & 8, Pentecostal preaching and forgiveness,
- 7. Acts 9, Saul's conversion and divine healing.
- 8. Acts 10, Gentiles baptized in the Spirit.
- 9. Acts 11, the new center of Christianity begins at Antioch.
- 10. Acts 12, persecution at Jerusalem with Peter in Jail.

(And Then Paul's 3 Great Missionary Journeys)

- ♦ Paul's first mission is (chapters 13:1 14:28)
- ◆ Paul's second mission is (chapters 15:36 18:22)
- ◆ Paul's third mission is (chapters 18:23 21:17)

(Its Where We Pick Up Today)

Question: What is Paul doing in Acts 18:23?

Answer: He is doing two things that speaks to all of us:

- #1. He is resting before starting out on the third journey:
 - ♦ The words in 18:23 "Spent some time there" mean, Paul was getting some R&R in Antioch.
- #2. He is purposeful as he heads out on journey #3:

Question: What is Paul's purpose as God uses Him?

Answer: Acts 18:23 "After spending some time in Antioch (resting), Paul departs and passes through

Galatia and Phrygia, visiting the believers, encouraging them and helping them to grow in

#2. Spiritual Growth

the Lord".

Question: Why is God sending Paul out the 3rd time?

Answer: Because God wants you (His people, His bride, His church) to experience two things.

- #1. He wants you to be encouraged!
- #2. He wants you to be growing!

Question: What is God's will and purpose for Paul's ministry?

Question: Why is God sending Paul to different people groups?

Question: What does God want to do in your heart today?

#1. Spiritual Encouragement (and)

Question: How does God encourage and grow people in Acts 19?

Answer: This is what God does:

- #1. In Acts 18:24, Apollos arrives in Ephesus.
- #2. In Acts 18:25, Apollos teaches the Word of God.
- #3. In Acts 18:26, Apollos is taught himself by Priscilla and Aquila.
- #4. In Acts 18:27 & 28, Apollos is invited to Corinth (so he leaves Ephesus). (Pg. 1 of 4)

(And In Acts 19:1)

"And it came about, that while Apollos was at Corinth, Paul having passed through the upper country came to Ephesus and found some disciples."

Question: Where is Paul in Acts 19?

Answer: He's in Ephesus. **Question:** Why is Paul there?

Answer: God wants to encourage and grow disciples.

<u>Ouestion</u>: What is Paul's message (or God's message) that encourages and grows the heart? Answer: God wants us to experience 3 things that will encourage and grow a spiritually

healthy person:

(All 3 Involve The Word Baptism)

I. John's Baptism (Vs. 2-4)

Question: What were Paul's first words to the 12 disciples in Ephesus?

Answer: Acts 19:2 "Have you received the Holy Spirit since you believed? And they said to

him "No, we haven't even heard that there is a Holy Spirit".

Question: What is Paul asking?

Answer: Paul isn't asking these disciples if they possess the regenerating Spirit that all believers possess at salvation.

♦ He is asking them if they have received the Holy Spirit in His infilling of power.

◆ These disciples had been converted through the ministry of Apollos.

♦ And, Paul (rather God) has more for them.

Question: What does Paul then ask them?

Answer: (V. 3), "Unto what then were you baptized"? And they said, "The baptism of John"

Question: What does Paul say in v. 4?

Answer: (V. 4), "Then said Paul, John verily baptized with the baptism of repentance"

Question: Pastor, what is the baptism of repentance?

Answer: It is the desire to turn from sin and turn to God with all your heart!

Question: What's the problem?

Answer: The problem was - that John's message was "Repent of sin" but John himself could

not forgive sin.

♦ So Paul says in V. 4, "Believe on Him which should come after John, that is, on Christ Jesus".

(In Other Words)

- ♦ These believers in Ephesus had followed the baptismal procedure of John.
- ◆ They were willing to repent of every sin.
- ♦ But God (through Paul) tells them what John had already said in Matthew 3:11:

"I baptize you in water for repentance, but Jesus Himself will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire"

Question: What is John's baptism?

Answer: It is one of Repentance!

Question: What does it mean to repent?

Answer: It means to say "God you're right, I am wrong".

- "God, I deserve judgment, but I ask for mercy".
- ◆ "God, you have not failed me, I have failed you".
- "God, I ask you to cleanse me of every sin, examine my heart, turn my heart to you, and deliver me from every besetting sin, to serve you in wholeness".

Question: Why is this in Acts 19?

Answer: Because every encouraged and growing Christian is quick to respond with repentance toward God. (Pg. 2 of 4)

Question: How does repentance encourage your heart?

Answer: Repentance encourages the heart because the fruit of repentance is a clear

conscience.

♦ And a clear conscience can experience the joy of the Lord. (Why?)

♦ Because nothing stands between you and God.

(#1 – John's Baptism Means Repentance)

II. Water Baptism (V. 5)

Question: What is the fruit of true repentance?

Answer: Obedience

Question: What did the Ephesian believers do after they repented and were forgiven?

Answer: (V. 5), "When they heard this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus".

Fact: This is the only re-baptism in water in the Bible.

Fact: These believers who were baptized by John (for their repentance...)

... are now re-baptized in Jesus name because they exercise faith in Jesus that Jesus has forgiven them of all their sin!

(In Other Words)

♦ In John's baptism they turned from sin.

♦ In water baptism, again, they are now assured that Jesus has forgiven their sin and completed what John had said.

Question: Why is (V. 5) in your Bible?

Answer: To show us that the fruit of genuine repentance – is genuine obedience.

(I Repeat) • The genuine <u>fruit</u>, of genuine <u>repentance</u>, is genuine <u>obedience!</u>

(In Other Words)

- ♦ Water baptism doesn't save me!
- ♦ It just tells the <u>world</u>, the <u>church</u>, and the <u>Lord</u>, that I'm coming out of the water to live in obedience to God in every area of my life.

(In Other Words)

- ♦ It's possible to repent and turn from sin, but still not surrender in obedience to God.
- ♦ It's possible to stop sinning, but not start obeying what God tells you in His Word.
- ♦ You can quit smoking and stop drinking and cease cursing, and quit stealing,

(Yet Still)

♦ Not obey God when it comes to praying, forgiving, tithing, serving, etc.

(In Other Words)

- God doesn't just save you from something. He also saves you to something.
- ♦ God doesn't just deliver you <u>out</u> of something, He delivers you <u>for</u> something.

(In Other Words)

#1. John's baptism – means Repentance. #2. Water baptism – means Obedience.

(In Other Words)

- ♦ When you are genuinely saved as a Christian, man or woman 2 things occur:
 - #1. In repentance, you stop some old behavior,
 - #2. In obedience, you begin some new behavior.

III. The Holy Spirit Baptism (Vs. 6, 7)

Question: Why did God send Paul to this group of John's disciples in Ephesus?

- ♦ In verse 2, to ask something,
- ♦ In verse 6, to do something.
- ♦ In verse 2, "Have you received the Holy Spirits infilling since you believed?"
- ♦ In verse 6, "And when Paul laid his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came upon them and they spoke in tongues and prophesied." (In Other Words)
- ♦ Apollos could only teach as much as he knew.
- ♦ So when Paul reaches Ephesus, he is troubled:

Question: What is Paul troubled about?

Answer: Paul discovers a lack of spiritual gifts,

Paul discovers a lack of spiritual anointing,

Paul discovers a lack of spiritual power.

Question: So what does Paul do?

Answer: He teaches on the baptism in the Holy Spirit.

- ♦ Then he lays his hands on them in prayer to aid them in their faith.
- ♦ And the disciples here receive the infilling of the Holy Spirit.
- ♦ And speak in tongues during their own personal experience of Pentecost.

Question: Is this an isolated experience?

Answer: Not at all.

(This is the fifth time the Spirit is poured out on a group of people)

- #1. The Jews in Jerusalem. (Acts 2)
- #2. The prayers (Acts 4:31)
- #3. The Samaritans in Samaria. (Acts 8)
- #4. The Gentiles in Caesarea. (Acts 10)
- #5. Now the disciples in Ephesus are baptized in the Holy Spirit. (In Acts 19)

Question: Why is this baptism so important?

Answer: Because we need God's power to do God's work.

(That's Why Jesus Said In Luke 24:49)

"Tarry in the city of Jerusalem until you are endued with power from on high"

Question: How do you receive the baptism in the Holy Spirit?

- #1. Understand it is a gift from God.
- #2. Open your heart in prayer and praise to God.
- #3. Yield yourself to the "Welling up" that takes place in your spirit and allow the Holy Spirit to flow out of you in a heavenly language.
- ♦ You do the speaking as God does the pouring out.

(If You Want To Be Encouraged And Growing)

- #1. Repentance to turn and forsake every sin.
- #2. Obedience to whatever God tells you to do.
- #3. Power as you serve the Lord in the power of the Holy Spirit.
