- ♦ He Was Anointed By The Spirit

# "The Spirit Of Courage" Message #1

**Text:** Joshua 1:1-9

Subject: "The Spirit And The Attitude That God Will Honor"

# (Why Minister The Book Of Joshua?)

1. The book of Joshua is a book of new beginnings for God's people.

- 2. It's a book that illustrates how we can say "good bye" to the old life and enter into the new life.
- 3. It's a book that reveals to us practical insights:
  - How courage is born in your heart,
  - How perseverance will be rewarded by God,
  - ◆ How God gives confidence in the face of difficulties,
  - ◆ How the presence of God is our greatest assurance.

# (The Main Theme Of Joshua Is:)

♦ How to move forward and possess the inheritance God intends for you to possess.

# (Joshua Was Commissioned To Do Three Things)

- #1. Lead the people into the promise land.
- #2. Defeat the enemy that stood in the way.
- #3. Claim the inheritance that was promised by God.

# (Joshua Is A Type Of Christ)

- 1. His name; "Joshua" means: "Jehovah Saves"
- 2. <u>His purpose</u>; was to cross over Jordan into enemy territory, and take back what belonged to God. (Jesus did this at Calvary).
- 3. His message to us; we have a race to run and a crown to gain!

# (In Other Words)

- It is impossible to stand still in Christian life.
- We're either going forward or going backward.
- ◆ And, God has ordained it that we march forward as people of faith.

# (Joshua Was A "Forward Marcher")

- ◆ In chapter 1-5, He dedicates the nation to God.
- ◆ In chapter 6-12, He defeats the enemies of God.
- ◆ In chapter 13-22, He claims the inheritance and divides the land.
- ◆ In chapter 23,24, He gives his final message.

## (And All The While)

- ◆ Joshua wants to go from the wilderness to the place of rest.
- From Kadesh Barnea (unbelief) to Canaan (and victory).
- From outside the promise land, to inside the promise land (where faith is rewarded).

#### (Remember)

- ♦ When Israel was in Egypt, the enemy was around them making life miserable.
- ◆ When Israel crossed the Red Sea, the enemy was behind them, in pursuit.
- ◆ But when Israel crosses the Jordan River (in ch. 3) the enemies are before them, and every enemy would be conquered by faith.

#### Questions?

- ◆ Do you have any Egyptians in your life, people that are around you that make life miserable for you?
- ◆ Do you have any Jordan Rivers in front of you, things that seem impossible to cross over?
- ◆ Do you have any Jericho walls up against you, and you wonder how they'll ever come down?
- ◆ Do you have any battles, struggles, valleys or mountains and you need to hear what Joshua heard in chapter 1 from God?:

"Be strong and of a good courage"

"Be not afraid, neither be dismayed"

"As I was with Moses, so I will be with you"

# (Introduction Of Chapter 1)

- (v. 1) "Now after the death of Moses the servant of the Lord, it came to pass, that the Lord spoke unto Joshua, the son of Nun, Moses' minister, saying"
- (v. 2) "Arise, go over this Jordan into the land which I have given you"

# (Remember)

- ◆ For 40 years, Moses had been Israel's leader in religious, domestic, judicial, military and civic matters.
- ◆ Moses's leadership ends and Joshua (his understudy and assistant for 40 years) will now fulfill what God had begun with Moses.
- ◆ Moses wasn't allowed to lead Israel into the Promised Land because of disobedience. (Numbers 27:12-14)
- ◆ Moses asked God to give the people a leader, and God appointed Joshua. (Numbers 27:12-23)
- Moses was awesome as he transferred the reins over to Joshua:
- #1. Moses publicly told the people that God would now use Joshua to defeat their enemies.
- #2. Moses encouraged Joshua to not be afraid. (Deut. 3:22)
- #3. Moses laid hands on Joshua and God imparted the spirit of wisdom for the task ahead. (Deut. 34:9)

# (What's The Word To Joshua And To You Today?)

"Be strong and of a good courage; be not afraid neither be thou dismayed: For the Lord thy God is with thee whithersoever thou goest". (1:9)

#### (But Pastor)

- ◆ How do I maintain a Joshua Spirit?
- ◆ How do I face my Jordan Rivers and Jericho Walls with faith and courage?
- ♦ How do I go from victory to victory in every spiritual battle?

- ◆ How do I possess what God intends for me to possess?
- ◆ How do I prepare myself so God can be strong on my behalf (and give me my mountains)?

# (This Morning) "Characteristics Of A Courageous Spirit"

# Characteristic #1: Is Found In Exodus 17:8-13

- 1. Joshua comes into focus for the first time here.
- 2. Amalek (Esau's grandson) is the ruthless enemy of Israel.
- 3. Joshua followed Moses' instructions and went to war.
- 4. Moses said he would intercede and pray for victory.
- 5. And Joshua's first battle and victory build into him a courageous spirit.

## (What Did Joshua Learn?)

- #1. That our battles are fought down here in the physical (in the valley).
- #2. But our battles are won or lost in the heavenlies.

#### (Notice)

- ◆ (v. 11) When Moses' hands are up (Joshua prevails).
- ♦ (v. 11) When Moses' hands are down (Joshua loses).

# (And Joshua Learns In The Very Beginning)

- A courageous spirit is born in the place of prayer.
- Evil powers under satan's direction were the actual forces behind the Amalekites.
- Joshua wasn't contending with flesh and blood,
- He was involved in spiritual warfare.
- ◆ And He discovered the power of prayer in the life that marches forward in God.

**Question:** What is a courageous Spirit?

Answer: It is the man or woman who knows, that there is victory in prayer over the powers of the devil!

- ◆ You know that there is an unseen conflict behind the scenes.
- ◆ You know that it gets intense at times.
- ◆ But you know that in secret prayer, you align yourself with God who fights and conquers the powers of darkness

# Characteristic #2 Is Found In Exodus 24:13-16:

- #1. This is the second time Joshua is mentioned.
- #2. Moses was called up to the top of Mt. Sinai to receive the law and the tabernacle blueprints.
- #3. Aaron, his sons, and the elders accompanied Moses and Joshua.
- #4. Then, Moses and Joshua went further toward Sinai.
- #5. As they approached the summit, a cloud covered it for six days.
- #6. On the 7th day, God called Moses to come up to His presence in the midst of the cloud.
- #7. And, Joshua was not allowed to enter the cloud of glory, but had to just wait for 40 days until his pastor returned: (Pg. 3 of 6)

- ♦ For 40 days (No Moses)
- ♦ For 40 days (All alone)
- ◆ For 40 days (Just waiting and on hold)
- ◆ For 40 days (Faithful, hidden, no limelight, no recognition, no sharing in the glory cloud).

Question: What keeps an assistant pastor faithful, a church member faithful, a man or woman faithful during the dull and unknown season?

Answer: Characteristic #2 (I call it) "A willingness to serve God and care less who gets the credit".

# Characteristic #3 Is Found In Exodus 33:11:

- #1. In Exodus 32, Moses cleaned house because of idol worship at the golden calf.
- #2. Moses was angry and ground the calf to powder, cast the powder into the water, and made the people drink it.
- #3. Moses then took the tabernacle (or tent of God's presence) and set it up outside the camp.
- #4. Up till this time, the center of worship was easily accessible to everyone.
- #5. But now, the removal of the tent to the outside of the camp, put the people to a test:
  - ◆ Who really and truly wants to worship God?
  - Who is really willing to separate themselves from the camp and pay the price?
- #6. Exodus 33:11 reveals, that following a season of worship, Moses returned to the camp.

#### (But What Did Joshua Do?)

(v. 11) "Joshua departed not out of the tabernacle". (Why Not?)

• So he could fellowship, intercede and continue to worship.

# (It's Part Of A Courageous Spirit) What Is It?

- "A willingness to give up something temporary, for something eternal.
- "A willingness to sacrifice the immediate, for intimacy with God.
- "A willingness to narrow my interest to seek the face of God".

# Characteristic #4 Is Found In Numbers 14:6-9:

- #1. In Numbers 13, God sent out 12 spies to scope the land.
- #2. When the spies returned, 10 carried an evil report (full of doubt and unbelief).
- #3. Numbers 13:30 "Caleb says we can possess it".
- #4. Numbers 13:31 The other spies say, we can't go up".
  - (v. 31) "They are stronger than we are".
  - (v. 32) "They're too big to conquer.
  - (v. 33) "We're like grasshoppers in our own sight".

**Question:** What was Joshua's response and report? Numbers 14:8 "The Lord will bring us in". Answer:

> (v. 9) "They are bread for us to take". "The Lord is with us, fear not".

- ◆ 10 spies focus on their limitations. ◆ 10 spies murmur, complain and spread evil reports.
- ◆ 10 spies see their need (but not God). ◆ 10 spies poison the whole congregation.

#### (Results?)

- A whole generation would die in the wilderness.
- ◆ A whole generation would spend 40 years wandering.
- ◆ Joshua and Caleb would be the only adults who crossed the Red Sea and crossed over Jordan into the Promise Land of Canaan.

# (But What Did Joshua Say In V. 9?)

◆ "The Lord is with us, fear not"

**Question:** What is a courageous spirit?

Answer: 

Believing that God is bigger than your problems.

◆ Seeing God's supply in the face of your need!!!

♦ Knowing that God will do what God said He will do.

Question: Are you facing any giants today?

**Question:** Has the devil been taunting you; tempting you to murmur or complain?

Question: Are you facing a mountain that looks too high to climb?

**Question:** Do you need a job or a financial miracle?

Question: Has the doctor said you're ill and you need the gift of healing?

**Question:** Is their an impass or roadblock in your relationship with your husband or wife.

**Question:** Do your hurdles and obstacles look like giants and you feel like a grasshopper?

# (Then Pray For A Joshua Spirit)

And believe God, let faith arise, and see that God is bigger than your problems and challenges and anything that would intimidate you.

# Characteristic #5 Is Found In Numbers 27:15-23:

- #1. This is the next event in Joshua's life (his appointment as Moses' successor).
- #2. Moses had prayed for the right person to follow him.
- #3. Here is where many pulpit committees panic, where carnal opinions are voiced, where politicking begins.
- ◆ "Who is the most gifted?" ◆ "Who is the most talented?" ◆ "Who has personality and charisma?"

**Question:** What was God looking for?

Answer: (v. 18) "Take thee Joshua, a man in whom is the Spirit of God, and lay thine hand upon him".

**Question:** What is it that gives you a spirit of courage to face whatever you face?

- Being continually filled with the Spirit of God.
- Obedient to the initial promptings of the Holy Spirit.
- Separating yourself from anything that would grieve the Holy Spirit in your life.

# Characteristic #6 Is Found In Numbers 34:16, 17:

- #1. Joshua is mentioned next as one of the men to divide the land for the various tribes.
- #2. This was one of those menial, detailed jobs to administrate.
- #3. I call it one of those behind the scenes, not much glory and recognition details.
- #4. But this appointment by God was to encourage and prepare Joshua for greater responsibility.

#### (What Is This Detail?)

- It's the characteristic of servanthood.
- ◆ A willingness to advance others at the expense of yourself.
- ◆ A humble and meek spirit that finds a need and meets that need.
- Counting it a privilege to be faithful to God.
- ♦ Knowing that there is no little job in the kingdom when it is done for God.

# Characteristic #7 Is Found In Deuteronomy 31:7,8

- #1. This is the final charge before taking over the responsibility of leadership in Deut. 34:9
- #2. It's a remarkable promise and command in front of all the people:

"Be strong and of a good courage"

"You and the people are going into the land"

## (How Can We Be Sure?)

## (v. 8) The Lord had good news for then and now:

- "I'm going before you"
- "I'm going with you"
- "I'll not fail you"

- "I'll not forsake you"
- "Fear not, neither be dismayed"

## (The Word "Dismayed" KHAW-THATH means:)

- 1. To be confused
- 2. To be beaten down
- 3. To break down
- 4. To be discouraged

# (Characteristic #7 Is:)

- ◆ An Assurance From God For Your Heart.
- ◆ It is God's covenant with you and me.
- ◆ It produces a spirit of courage in your heart.

## (What Is It?)

Knowing that the one who has saved you, is the one who will keep you!

# (Want A Spirit Of Courage?)

- #1. Know that your battles are won in the secret place.
- #2. Serve and care less who gets the credit.
- #3. Believe that God is bigger than your problems.
- #4. Give up the temporary to inherit the eternal.
- #5. Be filled with the Holy Spirit daily.
- #6. Advance others at the expense of yourself.
- #7. Know that the One who has saved you, is the One who will keep you!!
