"YOU ARE STRENGTHENED"

Text;

Ephesians 3:14-21

Subject:

"The Great Prayer God Wants To Answer"

Introduction

(Thus Far We've Discovered In Ephesians:)

- ♦ In chapter 1, you are **Accepted**, **Adopted**, and have great **assurance** that God In verse 11, is working all things after the counsel of His own will.
- ♦ In chapter 2, you've been Quickened, Raised and are seated (which means:)...
- ...you've been made alive, you've been elevated to a higher level of living and now have fellowship with Jesus continually.

(Now In Chapter 3)

- ♦ The Great Prayer from prison!
- ♦ Many call this the third most important prayer in all the Bible.
 - #1. The Lord's model prayer (Matthew 6:9-13)
 - #2. The Lord's prayer for His disciples. (John 17)
 - #3. The prayer of Paul from prison. (Ephesians 3)

Question: What's so incredible about this prayer?

#1. It was so important that it drove Paul to his knees in verse 14.

"For this cause I bow my knees"

- ♦ Bowing is a sign of dependency, reverence, humility and earnestness!
- So this prayer motivated Paul to desperation.
- #2. It was a prayer for spiritually minded people.
 - ♦ In Paul's first prayer (Ephesians 1:15-23), Paul prayed for enlightenment,
 - ◆ But in this prayer, Paul prays for enablement.
 - ♦ He wants us to lay hands on what God has provided for us. (In Fact:)
 - ♦ Other prison prayers deal with spirituality of the inner man, (not the material needs of the outer man). Philippians 1:9-11 and Colossians 1:9-12

(In Other Words)

- ♦ God records Paul's prayer in Scripture, so that we can pray this way!
- God inspired this to the Ephesians, so that we as well could be inspired.
- ◆ God wanted the believers then to receive something, and God wants us to receive something.
- God put this prayer in your hands, to lead you to pray and receive enablement from God.

Question: How many of you want what God wants you to have?

Question: Then, exactly, what is it we are taught to pray for, so that God can respond and answer?

Discover 3 Prayers God Wants To Answer

I. We Pray For "Strength" Of Heart (V. 16)

(Verse 16), "That God would grant you, according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened with might by His Spirit in the inner man".

Question: What was the first thing Paul prayed for?

Answer:

- ◆ Strength and power for the inner man!
- Strength and power by the Holy Spirit!
- ◆ God's presence and power in daily living!

Question: What does it mean to be strong?

Answer: The word "Strengthen" in verse 16, comes from the Greek word (KRATAIOTHENAI) which means:

#1. To be made strong,

#2. To be made tough,

#3. To be made enduring.

◆ It means to have force and energy to act, resist or endure.

Question: What does the word "Might" mean?

Answer: The word might (DUNAMEI) means, power, force and energy.

Question: Where does Paul tell us that this strength and might come from in verse 16?

Answer: "By His Spirit in the inner man". (In Other Words)

- ◆ The receiving of the Holy Spirit's help and power was not an optional matter.
- ◆ The disciples in Ephesus must experience this marvelous infilling of the Spirit.

◆ Its Paul's prayer for every believer.

Question: Why does Paul tell us to be strengthened and empowered? (So) **Answer:** "In the inner man" we can be renewed. (In Other Words)

◆ Its in the inner man of the heart and soul where we overcome things like:

1. Temptation to sin

4. Self and carnality

2. Trouble and pain

5. Fleshly propensities

3. Grief and sorrow

6. Discouraging lies

(In Other Words)

◆ To break lose of the flesh's power, our spirit must be made strong and mighty (in the inner man)

Question: Is it that important? **Answer:** Its important because:

#1. Every bit of spiritual food adds to your strength and endurance.

#2. As your strength increases, the frequency of sin decreases. (In Other Words)

◆ The nearer we come to God, the further we go from sin! (and)

◆ The further we go from sin, the stronger we become in God!

#1-We Pray For Strength

II. We Pray For "Submission" Of Heart (V. 17)

(Verse 17), "That Christ may dwell in your hearts by faith"

Question: What does it mean for Christ to "Dwell in our hearts"?

Answer: The word "Dwell" means:

1. To rule

2. To reign

3. To take up residence

- ◆ It's a word with deep meaning!
- ◆ It's a word that provokes us to action!
- ◆ The word "Dwell" (KATOIKESAI) means: (not only to rule, reign and reside in),
- ♦ It means, ... to live in a home

...to settle down

...to be at home with

(In Other Words)

- ◆ To pray that "Christ will dwell in our hearts" means:
 - #1. That we are conscious that Jesus resides within us, (and)
 - #2. We allow Jesus to control and guide and motivate our actions.
- ♦ I call this praying for a "Submissive Heart".
- 1. A heart where Jesus feels right at home,
- 2. A heart where Jesus is Lord and supreme.
- 3. A heart where Jesus leads and I submit to His Lordship.

Question: Is there any part of you not yet submitted to the Lordship of Jesus?

Question: Is there any reason why Jesus might not feel comfortable in your house?

Question: Are there any dirty dishes, any piles of clothes, any dust, any junk that Jesus would

have to step over if He came to your house (your heart)?

#1 – We Pray For Strength Of Heart #2 – We Pray For Submissiveness Of Our Heart And Will

III. We Pray For "Saturation" Of Heart (V. 19)

(Verse 19), "And to know the love of Christ, which passeth knowledge that ye might be filled with all the fullness of God"

Question: What does it mean to be filled with all the fullness of God?

Answer: It means to pray that God will (by His Spirit) fill us and flood us to overflowing.

- ◆ The language of this verse suggests a progressive and continual experience,
- ◆ It means to pray continually that God will constantly fill us.
- ◆ It means to be "Satisfied with an unsatisfied satisfaction".

(In Other Words)

- ♦ If we think we have all that God can possibly give we will stop seeking God for more, (and)
- ♦ When we reach an apex, there is only one direction to go, (That's down).

(On The Other Hand)

◆ If we realize God has more, we will keep seeking God and will be ever increasing in the power of the Holy Spirit.

(It's No Secret That:)

- #1. Paul started his prayer by requesting an increase of the power of the Holy Spirit, (in the inner man).
- #2. Paul ended his prayer with the same request. (Why?)
- ♦ Because we all need God's power to be successful in Christian service!
- ♦ Because no one has reached the apex (and doesn't need God anymore).
- ◆ Because there is room for expansion in us for the Holy Spirit to fill us more.

Conclusion

Question: Pastor, how do we know that God will answer prayer?

Question: How do I know that God will do what Paul prayed for in chapter 3?

Question: What gives us assurance as we pray and believe for these 3:

#1. A "Strengthened" Heart,

#2. A "Submitted" Heart, #3. A "Saturated" Heart?

(The Promise of Verse 20)

"Now unto Him that is able to do exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think according to the power that worketh in us"

- ◆ "Exceedingly" (means:) "To surpass, to overcome, and to go beyond any request".
- ◆ "Abundantly" (means:) "To overflow with more than enough".
- ◆ "Above All That We Ask Or Think" (means:) "To provide beyond any need present".
