Upright Trustworthy

GOODNESS IS...

- 1. That quality of character that clothes a person with moral stability.
- 2. That character quality upon which the gifts of the sprit can be safely built.
- 3. That character trait that causes a person to be thoroughly honest in all walks of life.
- 4. The result of keeping your life pure and free from weeds that sap your strength, joy and effectiveness.
- 5. A determination like Daniel, to not defile myself with the king's meat in any way, shape or form.
- 6. Being transparent and honest before God, always examining your own life instead of weeding someone else's garden.
- 7. That fruit in your character that allows God to entrust you with great responsibilities.
- 8. The voluntary consecration of my heart and will to the revealed will of God.
- 9. Putting to death all works of the flesh that do not glorify God.

- 10. Choosing righteousness at whatever the cost.
- 11. The fruit of a crucified life, allowing the cross to put to death the tendencies and appetites of my selfish nature.
- 12. Cooperating with God as His fire purges deep into my heart, revealing the real me that nobody else knows about.

He knows whom he is trying to please and he is willing to let the world think what it will of him. He will not be around much longer anyway, and where he is going, men will be known not by their Hooper rating but by the holiness of their character."

- 3. We will walk open before God, desiring the Holy Spirit to tap the things in our lives that must go.
- 4. We will live above reproach and blameless before men, upholding the testimony of Jesus.
- 5. We will receive the life of Jesus and pass this on to those we meet along life's journey.

HOW IS GOODNESS DEVELOPED?

Isaiah <u>saw</u> – The holiness of the Lord. (V. 1-3)

Isaiah said - "Woe is me." (V.5)

Isaiah felt – A live coal touching his lips (V. 6,7)

Isaiah <u>heard</u> – The Lord calling him to service. (V. 8)

Isaiah did – He volunteered to go. (V. 8)
